Saskatoon's new residential recycling program will help preserve our city's beauty for future generations to enjoy.

In 2011, the City of Saskatoon collected and recycled more than 7,000 tonnes of paper from our community recycling depots. With our new residential recycling program, we believe we can double that number to at least 14,000 tonnes in 2015.

PLEASE RECYCLE

PAPER FIBER MATERIALS – Do Not Bag or Tie

- Flattened corrugated cardboard and paperboard (i.e. empty cereal boxes, empty detergent boxes, empty tissue boxes)
- Newspapers, flyers, inserts, junk mail
- Magazines, catalogues, paperback books, hardcover books with covers and spine removed
- Telephone books
- Letter quality paper
- Brown paper bags, tissue roll cores, gift and packing paper (plastic shiny and aluminum, paper egg cartons)
- Envelopes with or without windows
- Cooper paper, computer printouts, NCR (no carbon required) paper

Please Bag or Tie

- Shredded paper



CONTAINERS – Clean and Rinse – Do Not Bag or Tie

- Aluminum soft drink and beer cans
- Household tin cans (please rinse)
- Milk cartons and jugs (please rinse and remove caps)
- Juice cartons, boxes and aseptic containers (please rinse)
- Plastic soft drink and water bottles (please remove caps)
- Place plastic shopping bags inside another bag and tie, includes clean plastic food wrap and clean plastic product wrap
- Household plastic containers and bottles – must have the recycling arrow with a number 1 through 7, as shown in the column on the right on the bottom. (A container with the arrow but no number means the container is made from recycled materials, but may not be recyclable itself and cannot be accepted.)
- Household glass clear, green or brown (please rinse and remove lids). No caps, dishes, saucers, window glass, mirrors, Pyrex, ceramics, light bulbs, porcelain or crystal



Only place items that are designated as recyclable within the blue recycling cart.

Carts will be monitored and unacceptable items will be left outside, or your cart will be rejected for collection. Plastic containers and bottles that are recyclable will have one of the following symbols on them:



DO NOT RECYCLE

- Wood, plasticized or food contaminated paper, cardboard, cups or paper plates
- Soiled tissues, napkins and paper towels
- Finely shredded paper (confetti size)
- Heavily dyed or coloured construction paper
- Styrofoam or other foam packing materials
- Household garbage, organic, hazardous or medical waste
- Disposable diapers



- Contaminated plastic food or product wrap
- Hazardous chemical containers (e.g. motor oil containers)
- Auto parts, batteries
- Any scrap metals other than household tin and aluminum cans
- Propane tanks, gasoline or any type of fuel containers
- Wire or plastic clothes hangers
- Clear plastic clam shell containers without the recycling arrows and number 1 through 7
- Plastic toys or Tupperware
- Plastic pipe
- Outdoor lawn furniture
- Items other than those listed in "Please Recycle" section above



Do not put any of the following items in your blue recycling cart:

- Hazardous material such as wet paint, chemicals or solvents
- Asbestos, soil, dirt, concrete or other heavy materials
- Construction or demolition materials such as boards, roofing materials and carpet
- Automotive parts, tires, oil filters or oil, tree clippings, limbs of any kind, animals or animal parts
- Refrigerators, electrical cords or computer cables, stoves, wood, dishware, cooking pans, or appliances

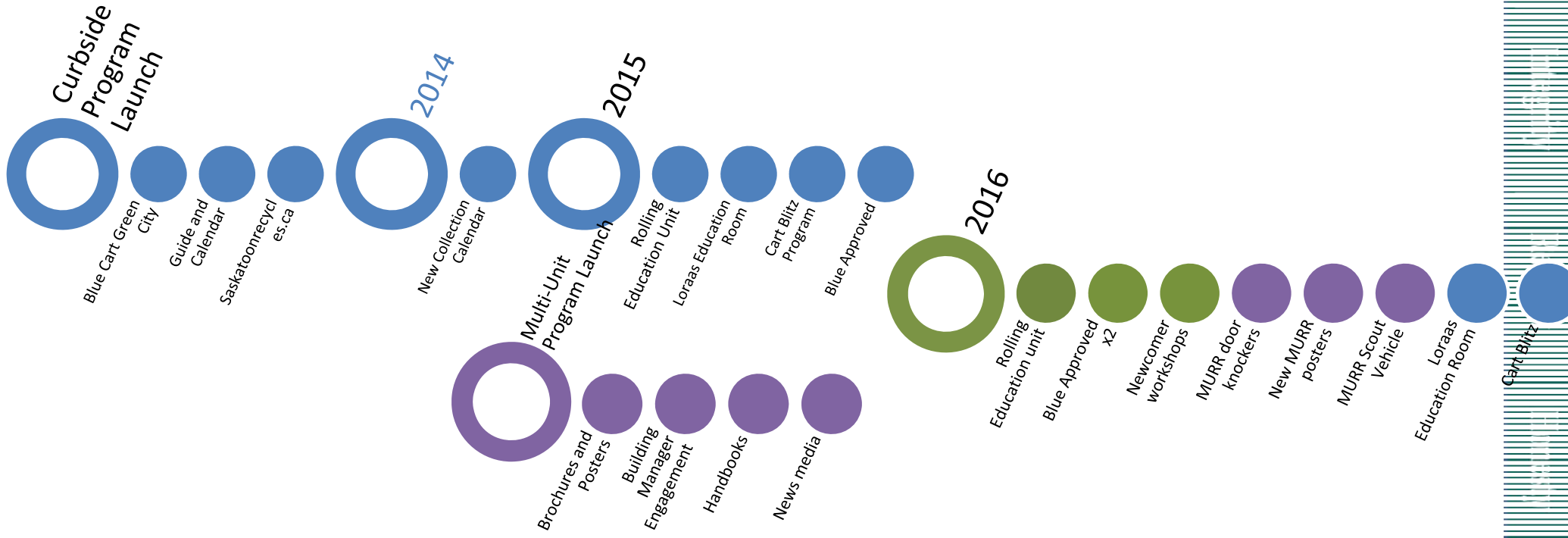

CART PLACEMENT



Front Street

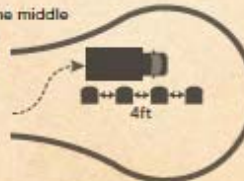
Place your cart on the street with the wheels facing the curb and 4 feet of clearance on all sides.

Back Lane

Place your cart on the edge of the lane, with the wheels facing the fence, and 4 feet of clearance on all sides.

Cul-De-Sac

Place your cart in the middle of the circle, facing the same direction as other carts, with 4 feet of clearance on all sides.

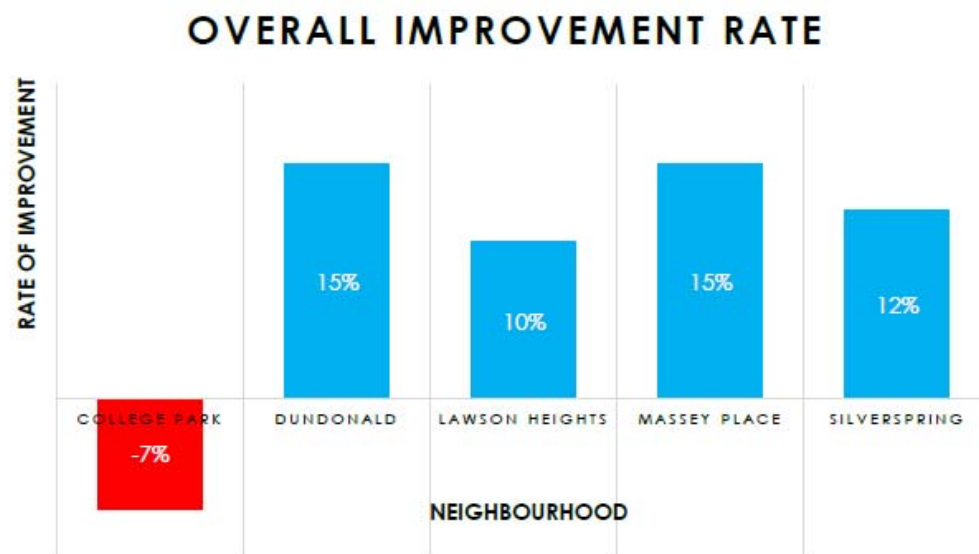
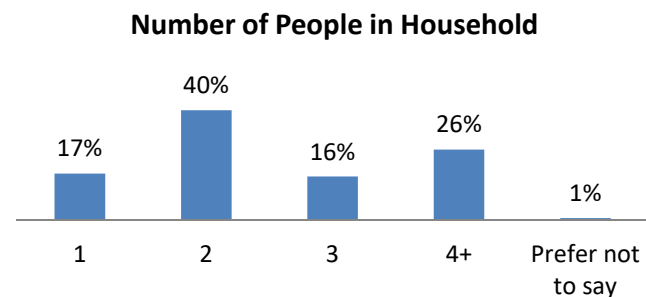
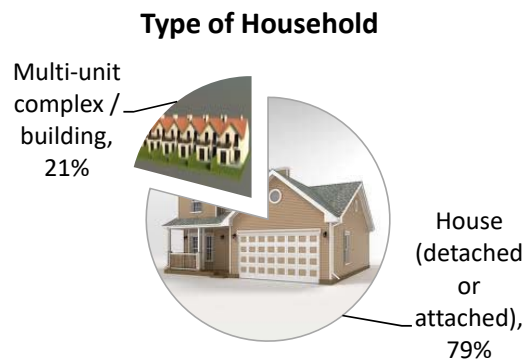
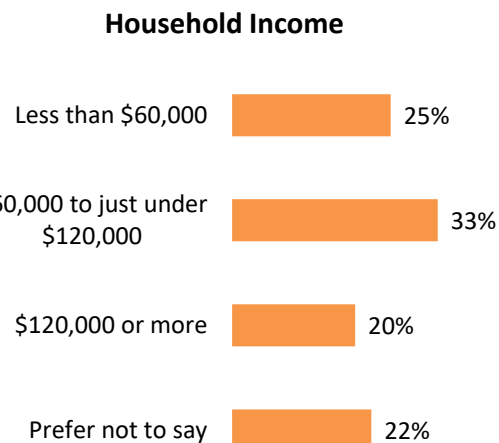


Figure 4: This figure illustrates the tag improvement rates for all neighborhoods over the six week collection period. Dundonald, Lawson Heights, Massey Place, and Silverspring show positive changes, while College Park shows a slight regression.

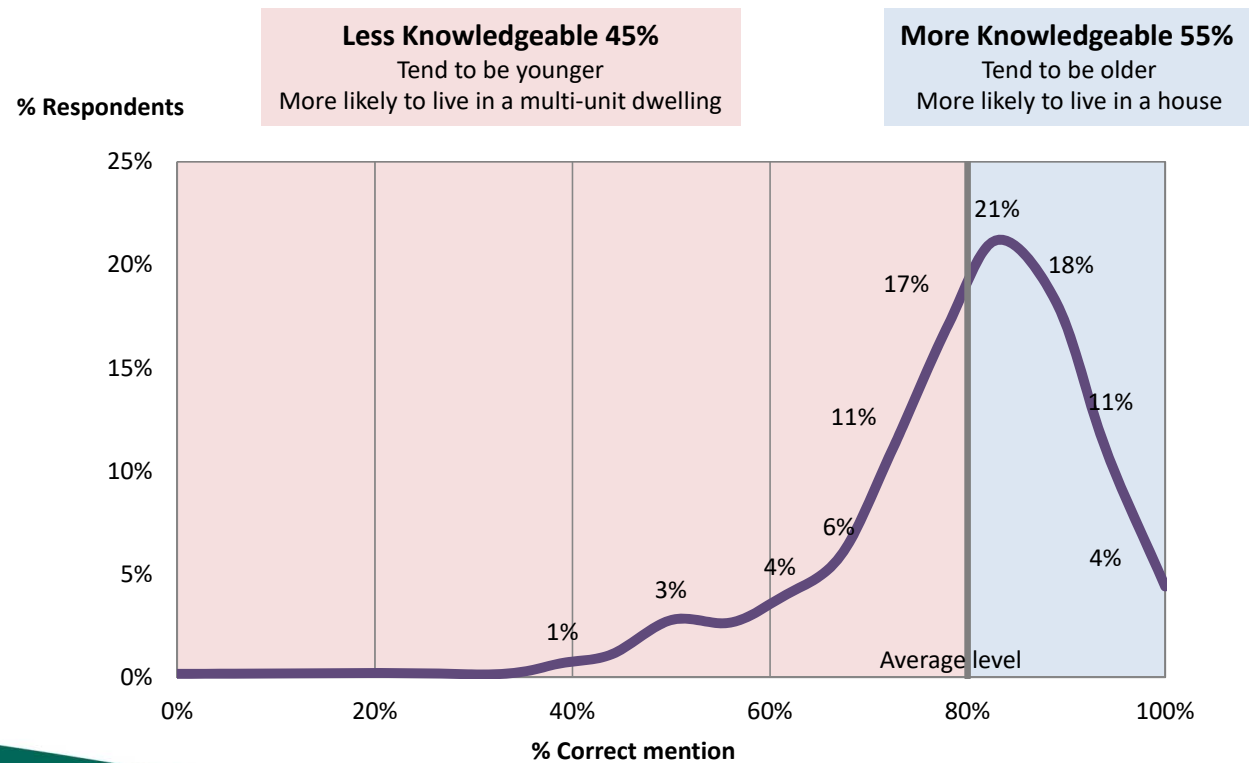

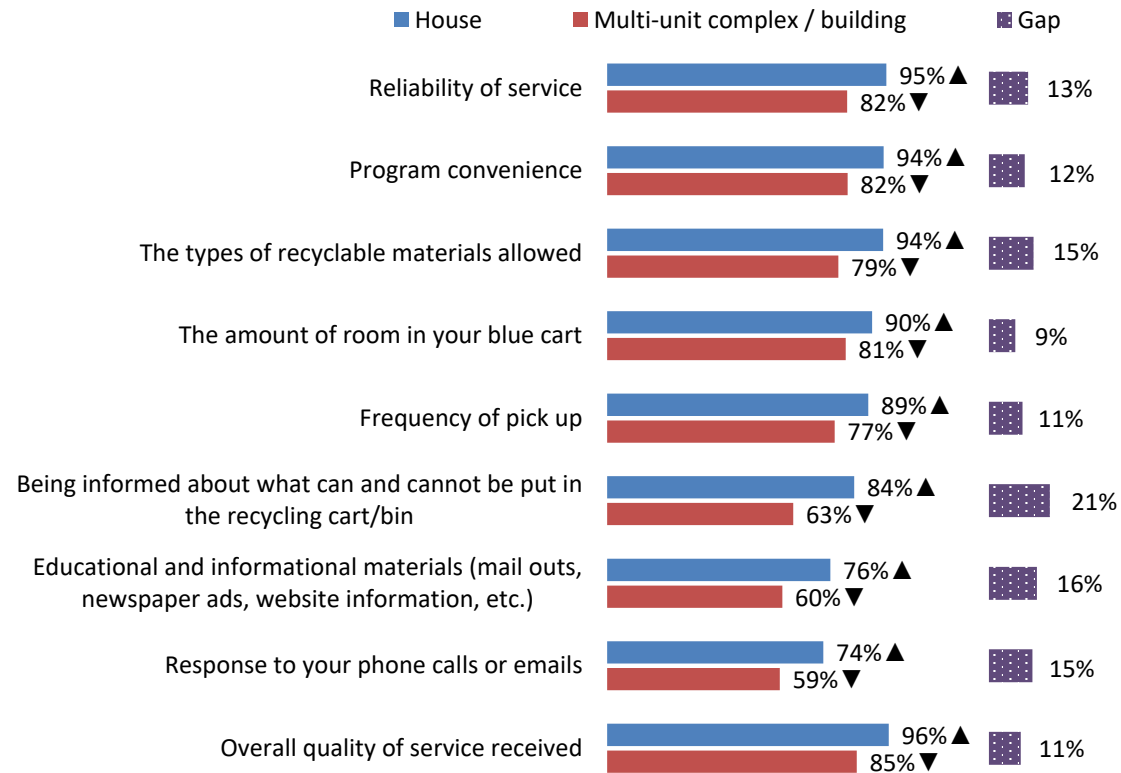

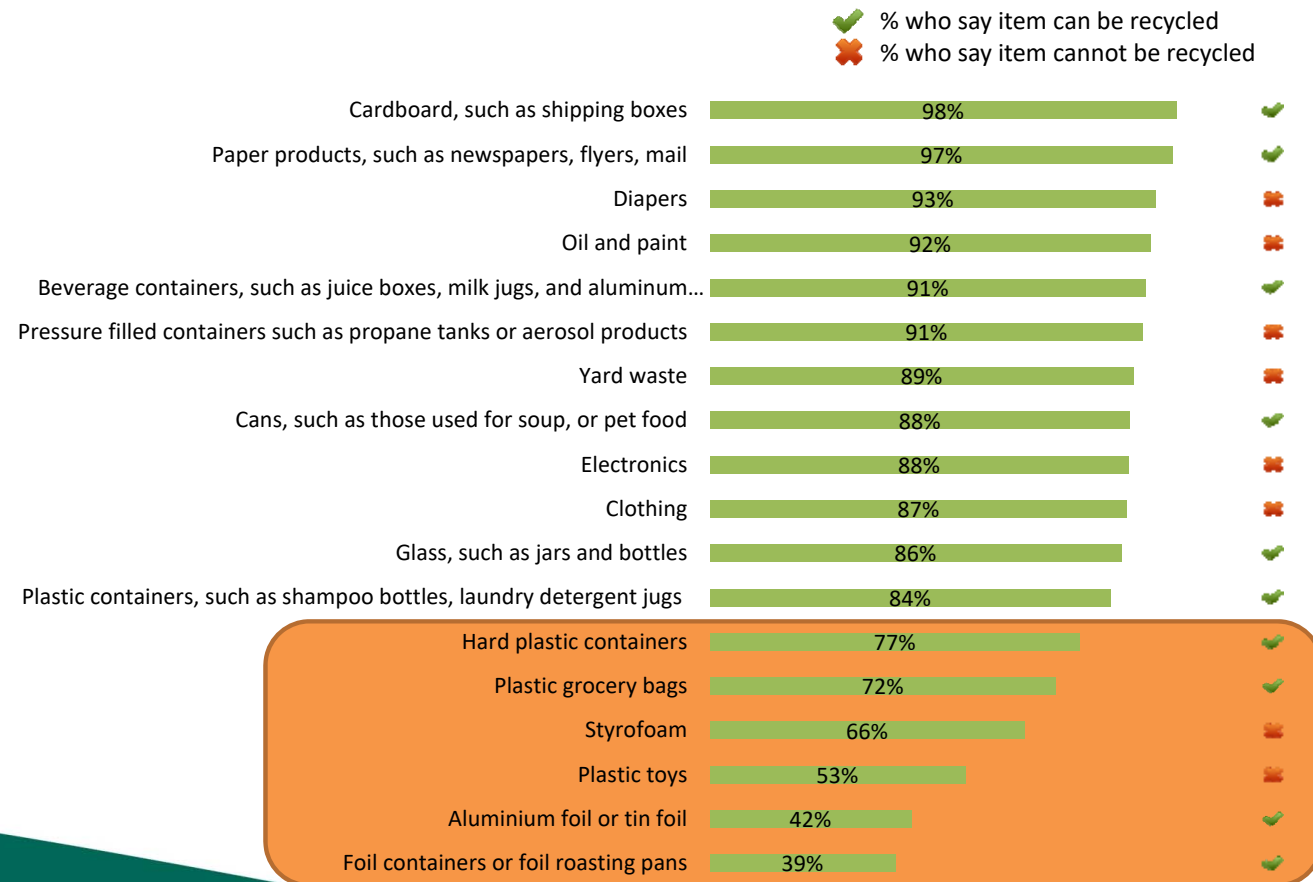
Program Satisfaction

% Very/somewhat satisfied



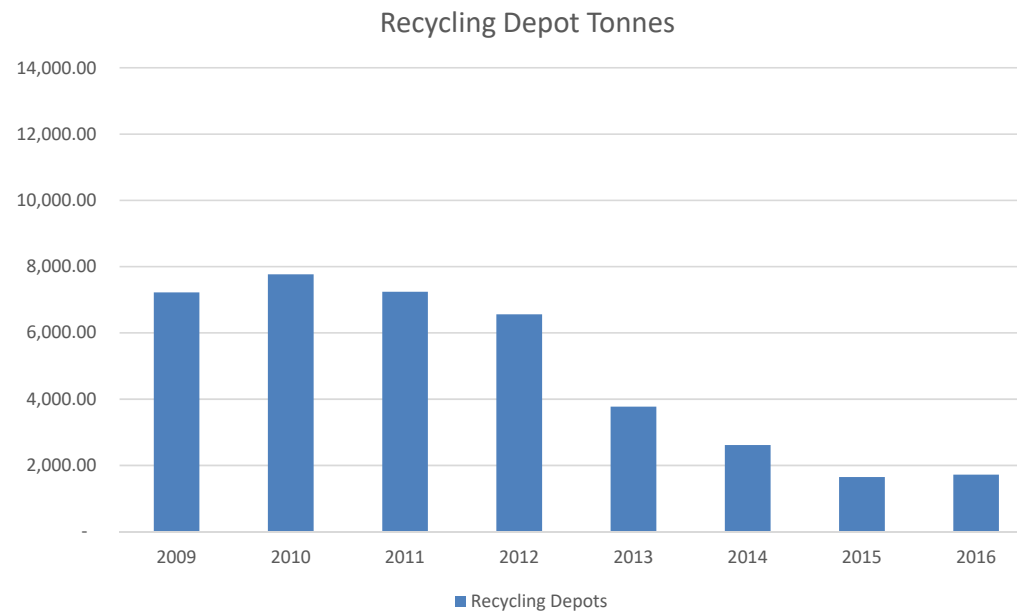
Knowledge of What can be Recycled

Knowledge of Recyclable Items in Household – Correct Mention



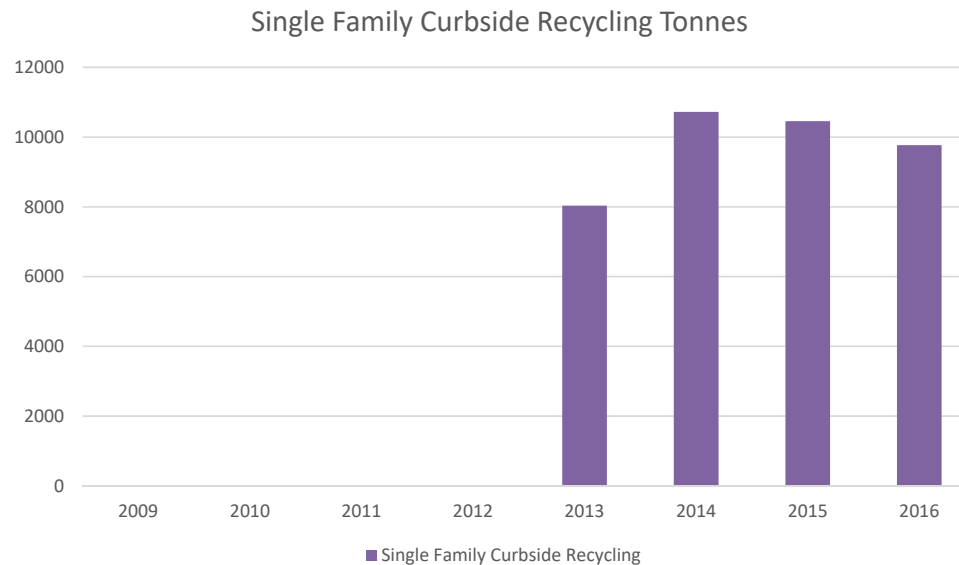

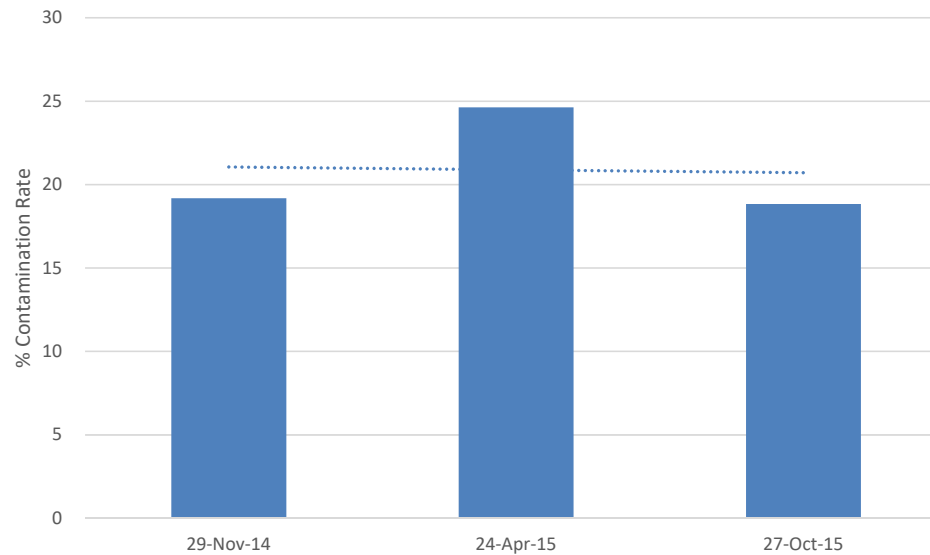

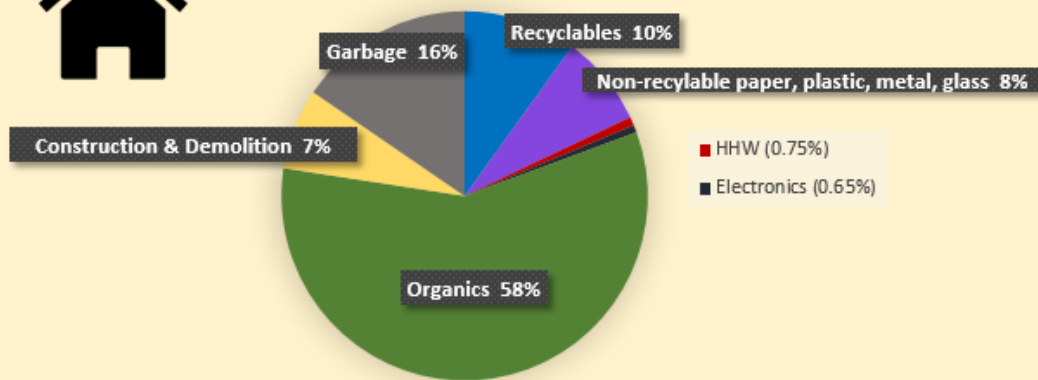
CONTAMINATION IN MULTI-UNIT RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING



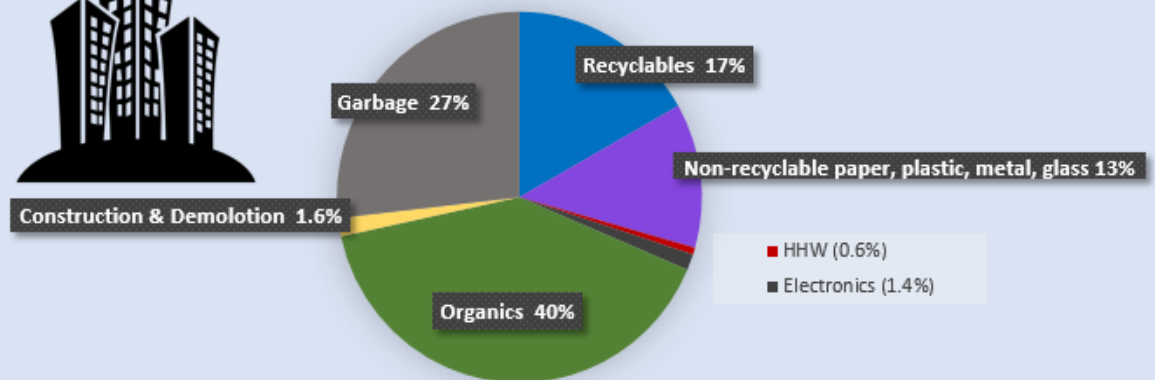
2016 CHARACTERIZATION

What will be lost if we don't keep recycling?

- By not recycling, we will lose over 250,000 trees each year.

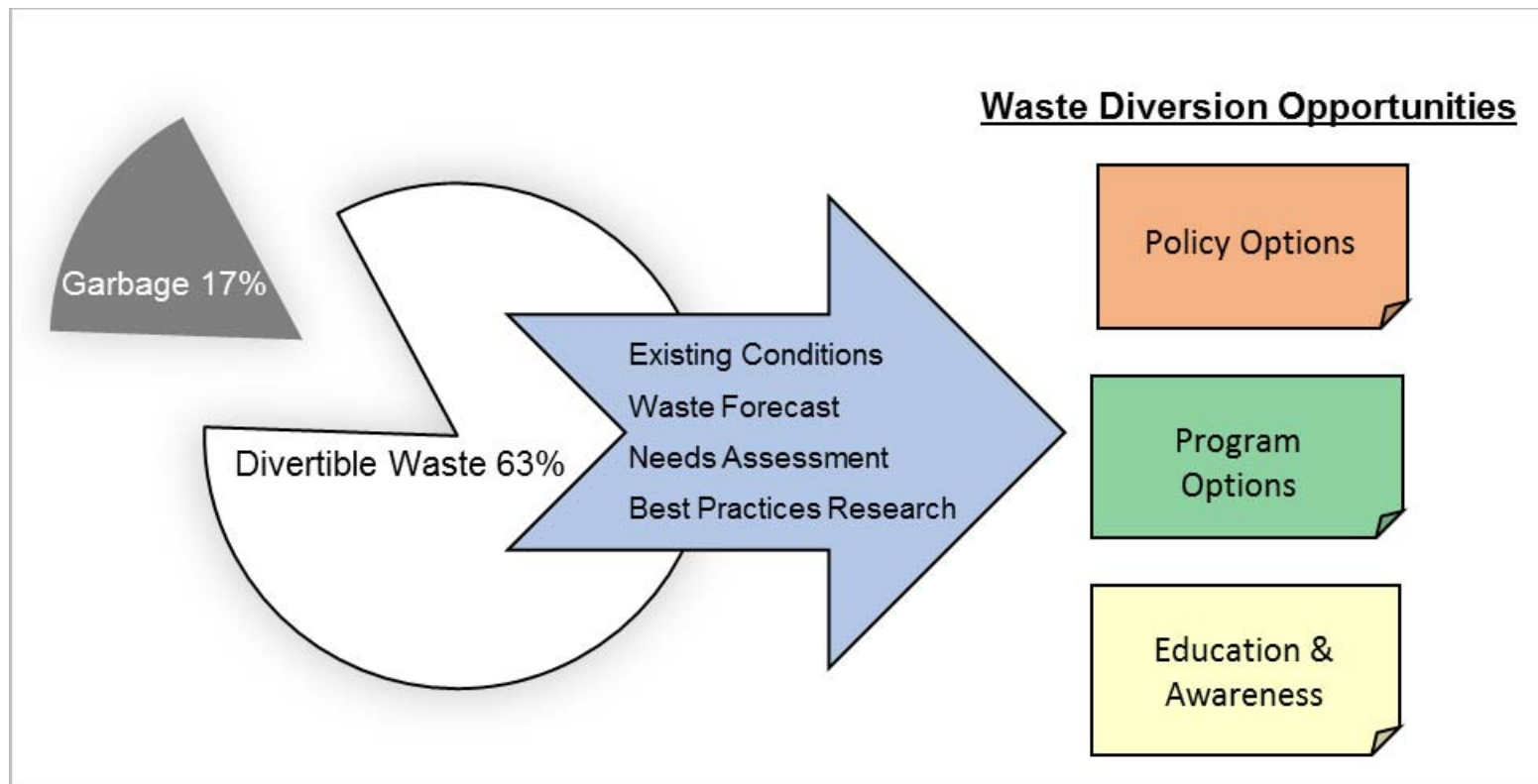
