

### The Agricultural Packaging Product Waste Stewardship Regulations

- transition from gov't funded to industry funded model
- user pays
- grain bags only
- Pilots: 973,088 kilograms
- Steward/first-sellers



# what's next?

A greener alternative to agricultural waste management



### Next steps to be managed (1):

### 1. Understanding the MOE directive

- First sellers were required to submit a plan by Jan 31,
   2017 (five worked with Cleanfarms to submit the plan)
- MOE to approve plan
- Cleanfarms is to operate in accordance with that plan
- First sellers' recruitment



### Next steps to be managed (2):

- 2. Addressing the 'non-program material' challenge
  - Consideration of a 'proof of purchase' requirement
  - A proof of purchase has both pros and cons
- 3. Establishing the Environmental Handling Fee (EHF) gov't currently want input into the establishment of this fee if it is to be visible



### Next steps to be managed (3):

- 4. Hiring a program coordinator in Saskatchewan (July)
- 5. Establishing standards for: (June)
  - Collection sites
  - Condition of grain bags
- 6. Development of 30 to 35 collection sites (now to Dec 31)
- 7. Establishment of a communications plan (after plan approval)
  - Needs to address EHF, awareness, promotion of environmentally sustainable farm practices through recycling.



### Item 5 - Collection site requirements (1)

- Ability to offer free drop off of grain bag
  - loose or rolled
  - ability to bale or roll loose bags
  - reasonable opening hours
- Space & ability to load trucks
  - minimum of 15-18 MT at one time
  - a full truck load
  - loaded into a 40' HC container (tightly rolled or baled)
  - ability to load
  - loading dock, forklift, enough space to accommodate a tractor-trailer, etc.



### Item 5 - Collection site requirements (2)

- Quality control
  - vector control
  - storage: clean material & no standing water
  - contaminant-free material
    - inspection of material dropped off
    - rolling or re-rolling of material
    - farmer education/communication



### Item 5 - Collection site requirements (3)

Proof of Purchase checking - TBD





### **But what about 2018?**

- First year has to be successful
- Grain bags returned are likely purchased in 2017
  - EHF starts in 2018
- Proof of Purchase checking in 2018 TBD
  - No, checking begins in 2019
- ↑ service, access
  - request for government funding
