The Planning Cycle







Guidebook 1: Starting the Planning Process

- Hold a community event








Guidebook 2:

- Brainstorm local observations of climate change






Guidebook 3:




Guidebook 4: Identifying Solutions

- Creating comprehensive list of priorities






Guidebook 5: Taking Adaptive Action





- The Climate Change Glossaries and Indigenous Languages Glossary Workbook aim to:
 - Increases cultural relevance and community ownership over the ICCAP toolkit and climate change adaptation planning process;
 - Engage a broader audience in climate change adaptation planning efforts in a culturally relevant and meaningful way; and
 - Support initiation of, or ongoing, language revitalization efforts.





Indigenous Language Glossary Example

- Askíy pimi ékí takwápoték éko ati nisiwanácitámakan nipiy ékota osci
- Éko nésám mistahi ká takok anima ká pimápoték asiskiy, ékwáni kita mosci píkwáko ana maskwami.

- Oil is infiltrating and affecting water systems
- If you have a lot of sediment in the water, the ice breaks down
